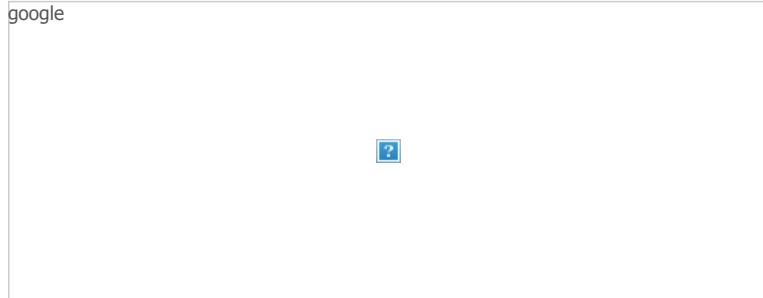


Need an Answer Then Google It
